



WHY?



- Why create and have a model of Lifelong Faith Formation?
- A clearly articulated model helps everyone understand the purpose and goals of lifelong faith formation and how your church is implementing them. Your model will promote maturing in faith at all ages and stages of life.


4 Models of Lifelong Faith Formation

Each of the four models or illustrations that we will look at has a distinct focus to guide the development of lifelong faith formation:

- (1) Life-stage
- (2) Thematic
- (3) Intergenerational
- (4) Worship



Three Kinds of Faith Forming Experiences Built around Life-stages and Holistic in nature



Types of Programming

Intergenerational – let's reconnect generations and the community

<u>Family</u> – bring families together and give them ways to grow as a family at home.

A model of lifelong faith formation

integrates these types of faith formation:

- **❖**Intergenerational,
- Family and
- Life stage

into a whole, providing direction for promoting maturing in faith through all of the ages and stages of life.

Goal Directed Model #1 –

Lifestage



In this model, Faith Formation is developed around **each stage of life**:

- children and families (0–10 or 0–5 and 6–10),
- adolescents (11–19),
- young adults (20s-30s),
- midlife adults (40s-50s),
- mature adults (mid 50s–mid 70s), and older adults (75+).

(Many churches combine several adult stages, adults.)

What does this look like?

 Core experiences in the Lifestage Model: Life Stage or age-related faith formation experiences, celebrations and networks

Supporting experiences in this Model: milestone celebrations such as sacraments and life transitions as well as networks and community-wide shared experiences for things like marriage prep, baptism prep, confirmation, First Eucharist, etc.

- Each stage of life incorporates the three essential faithforming experiences:
 - Intergenerational relationships, activities, and church life and events;
 - Family faith practices at home, and
 - Life stage activities to address the needs and situations and spiritual journey at each life stage.

Goal Directed Model #2 –

Thematic



In this Model, faith formation is built around an annual (or seasonal) churchwide theme that becomes the central focus of the whole community.

The theme can emerge from the lives of people, the life of the church community, events in the community and world, the Bible and theology, Christian practices, and more.

Faith formation opportunities on a theme can include intergenerational gatherings, family programs, life stage programs, online programs and activities, and more.

What does this look like?

 Core experiences: monthly, annual or seasonal theme with formation for all ages

Possible Supporting experiences: life stage celebrations and milestone networks

- Shared experiences for all ages
- Multi-year curriculum of themes that apply to all ages
- Themes can be annual or can overlap
- Programming can vary –can be Scripture based
- Theme acts as an "umbrella" over all catechetical and formational initiatives

- Programming can vary and focus on:
 - Scripture
 - Prayer and spirituality
 - Worship and Sacraments
 - Morality
 - A pastoral letter
 - Christian beliefs and practices
 - The Lectionary readings
 - Church feasts/seasons
 - Catholic Social Teaching/Social Justice issues

Goal Directed Model #3 –

Intergenerational Experiences at the Center



Core experience: All ages experiencing Faith Formation together as one; community focus

Possible Supporting experiences: life stage experiences and milestone celebrations and networks

In this model, faith formation is developed around keeping families together, encouraging parents in their role as the primary educators of the faith, as well as gathering the parish community. Grandparents are often very involved in this model.

What does this look like?

- Could have a multi-year curriculum of themes that apply to all ages or use one theme per year.
- Programs are conducted monthly, bi-weekly or weekly and offer shared faith formation experiences for all ages, such as a parish Mission, family faith sessions, seasonal programls like family stations of the cross, etc.
- Programming can vary and focus on
 - Scripture
 - Prayer and spirituality
 - Worship and Sacraments
 - Morality
 - Christian beliefs and practices
 - The Lectionary readings
 - Church feasts/seasons
 - Catholic Social Teaching/Social Justice issues

Goal Directed Model #4 –

Worship at the Center



Possible Supporting experiences: life stage and milestone experiences and networks

In this model, faith formation is developed *around* Sunday worship—the scripture readings, sermon, and ritual—with a weekly or monthly theme to focus formation.



For churches that are lectionarybased, the cycle of scripture readings forms the basis for the themes that can be addressed in faith formation.

What does this look like?

- Centered on Sunday
 Worship with Scripture
 readings, Sermon/Homily,
 and Ritual
- Lectionary cycle or a Worship series/ Sermon series forms the basis and structure of themes that can be addressed

- Programming can vary and focus on
 - Scripture/ a book of the Bible
 - Prayer and spirituality
 - Worship and Sacraments
 - The Liturgical Year
 - The Lectionary readings
 - Church feasts/seasons
 - Church history/ Biblical History




Lifestage-at-the-Center Model

Play and Worship (ages 3-5) and Young Moms groups Family Faith Formation (grades 1-8) High School Youth Ministry (grades 9-12) Young Roots (College aged ministry) Young Adult Ministry (20's, 30's, 40's) Adult Faith Formation Opportunities (all adults) Older Adults (Seniors Ministry) (Mostly ages 60+)

Family Faith (grades 1-8 and parents)





Our program combines online lessons the children do at home with their parents, and monthly Family Gatherings. We also offer community events, and resources for prayer, learning and fun activities.

Celebrations


- Receptions post Sacraments for families

- Blessings and programs for Life transitions such as retirement














Examples Thematic at the Center Programming - Winter





Winter Seasonal Programming based on our Theme

4. How do you put a plan together?



Be Informed by research on forming faith

Focusing on goals for faith maturing instead of classes and programs

Embracing holistic faith formation: intergenerational, family, and life stages

Scheduling in **seasonal menus** with a variety of programming: content, formats, times, spaces

Programming with **three models & three spaces**: online, hybrid, and physical

Personalizing through topic or theme based **playlists** of faith forming content and experiences

Evaluate and get feedback along the way

Begin with Goals for Maturing in Faith

Jesus

 Developing and sustaining a personal relationship and commitment to Jesus Christ

Discipleship

 Living as a disciple of Jesus Christ and making the Christian faith a way of life

Bible

 Reading and studying the Bible—its message, meaning, and application to life today

Teachings

• Learning the Christian story and foundational teachings of the Christian faith and integrating its meaning into one's life

Praying

• Praying—together and by ourselves—and seeking spiritual growth through spiritual disciplines

Goals for Maturing in Faith

Morality

• Living with moral integrity guided by Christian ethics and values

Serving

 Living the Christian mission in the world—serving those in need, caring for God's creation, and acting and advocating for justice and peace.

Worship

• Worshipping God with the community at Sunday worship, ritual celebrations, and the seasons of the church year

Engaged

 Being actively engaged in the life, ministries, and activities of the faith community

Gifts

• Practicing faith in Jesus Christ by using one's gifts and talents within the Christian community and in the world

Holistic Faith Formation - Example

Intergenerational

- Participate in several celebrations of Church year feasts & seasons
- Join the community in a service service project
- Participate in a leadership role or church ministry
- Participate in a Parish Mission

Family

- Develop a faith practice each season: prayer, Bible reading, Sabbath, etc.
- Celebrate church year seasons at home
- Participate in two whole family programs at church
- Participate in two service projects as a family

Life Stage / Peer Specific

• Select one's participation in courses, workshops, retreats, vacation Bible school, service projects and mission trips, etc.

D. Plan monthly, Seasonal or yearly menus

Seasons: Sept – Dec Jan – April May – Aug Variety of programming: content, formats, times, spaces




